



RANTHAMBORE NATIONAL PARK

How to reach –

Nearest railway station is Swaimadhapur away from 40 km on Mumbai – New Delhi via Kota route.



One of the country's most renowned



national parks and tiger reserve, Ranthambore is located at the junction of the Vidhya and Aravalli hills and bound by the river Banas in the north and Chambal in the south. Home to several animals, including leopards, jackals, sloth bear, panthers, wild pigs and deer, a large selection of reptiles

and migratory birds, as well as its most famous and sought after resident the tiger. The formidable and majestic Ranthambore fort, after which the park was named is located atop a steep hill within the reserve forest. The imposing structure offers spectacular views of the surrounding terrain and is home to three historic hindu temples. One can visit National Park during September to June.
